As a young man, I was very active in various social and humanitarian action programs in partnership with lot of friends - especially in the community development program in the suburban areas of Saigon in the 1960's at the raging war time.

As a jurist, I devoted most of the time to the research into the field of constitutional law – that's why I was arrested in 1990 by the communist government and sentenced 12 years of prison for "disseminating anti-socialist propanganda" just for writing a short guideline for the eventual new constitution.

In recent years as my age advances, I have joined various human rights organisations such as Vietnam Human Rights Network, Amnesty International etc... to efficiently contribute to the cause of human dignity of our people in Vietnam as elsewhere. That's also the best way to pay my dues to my beloved country Vietnam and to the humanity as a whole./
